



# STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

In addition to celebrating all Christ did for us this Easter season, we also are reminded of how His sacrifice impacts our lives.

Today's Gospel reminds us that Jesus should be the center of our lives. This passage begins with two disciples realizing Jesus had just appeared to them.

We can learn a valuable lesson from these disciples. To recognize Jesus' appearances in our lives, we need to know Him. And the best way to know the Lord is to spend time with Him. It can start with just 10 minutes of quiet prayer a day and increasing that each week. We might begin by reading Scripture, books on the lives of the Saints, or even a decade of the Rosary. Yet the goal should be to carve out time each day, in a quiet space, for just you and the Lord.

As the disciples mentioned, they recognized it was Jesus in the breaking of the bread. We, too, can better know the Lord through the sacraments, most especially the Holy Mass. The Eucharist is Jesus Himself — Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. What better way to grow in intimacy with Christ than to receive Him frequently or to go talk to Him in front of the Blessed Sacrament? As we make Jesus the center of our lives through prayer and the sacraments, we will be able to recognize Him in day-to-day moments.

As we are still in the midst of this Easter season, take time to think about what Christ did for us and the changes we should make in our daily lives to help us grow closer to Him.

### Pastor's Notes

#### Fr. Brian Lager

During the Easter Season, which is 50 days lasting until Pentecost, there are many symbols that maybe we have seen in the past but are not fully aware of their meaning. One of the most Easter symbols that is prominent in our Catholic Churches is the Easter Candle, or Paschal Candle. This candle is blessed at the Easter Vigil and burned throughout the Easter season in a prominent place in the church, ours being in the front next to the ambo, the place from which the readings and Gospel are proclaimed. This candle itself has tremendous symbolism embedded into it and I would like to take a moment to tell you more about it.

The Easter candle is required to be made from a majority amount of beeswax. So it has 51% beeswax in it. At the Easter Vigil we sing the Exultet, the praises of the Easter Candle, and we hear it sung "But now we know the praises of this pillar, which glowing fire ignites for God's honour, a fire into many flames divided, yet never dimmed by sharing of its light, for it is fed by melting wax, drawn out by mother bees to build a torch so precious. O truly blessed night, when things of heaven are wed to those of earth, and divine to the human. Therefore, O Lord, we pray you that this candle, hallowed to the honour of your name, may persevere undimmed, to overcome the darkness of this night. Receive it as a pleasing fragrance, and let it mingle with the lights of heaven. May this flame be found still burning by the Morning Star: the one Morning Star who never sets, Christ your Son, who, coming back from death's domain, has shed his peaceful light on humanity, and lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen."

When we bless the candle we make marks in it, the Alpha and Omega, the year, the cross, and we place 5 nails with grains of incense in it. The Alpha and Omega we hear about in Revelation 22:13. They are the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet symbolizing Christ is the beginning and end of all things. We mark the year symbolizing that Christ is the King of all time, even this year. The cross on it symbolizes how Christ reigns as King, servant of all. The nails with the grains of incense symbolize the 5 wounds of Christ.

The flame is the symbol of Christ as the light of the world we hear in John 1:4-5. The candle represents the pillar of fire that led the Israelites through the wilderness in their wandering for 40 years as Jesus guides and leads us in this "vale of tears" today. The wax itself reminds us of the purity of Christ. Beeswax is the most pure and cleaning burning wax there is. It also puts off a sweet odor that reminds us of the sweet odor of the Christian life that we are meant to spread by the way we live our lives according to Christ. The hard work of the bees in making the wax reminds us of the hard work we put in to live the Christian life and the great transformation of living that life in Christ to which we are called.

# History of the statue of the Risen Christ donated by John Seitz and Anna Marie (Sack) Seitz to St Joseph Church in Hays, KS circa 1927

With strong faith and in thanksgiving for a bountiful wheat harvest at the farm, John and Anna purchased a statue of the "Risen Christ" from Italy and donated it to St. Joseph church. The statue is on display during the Easter season and has been enjoyed by parishioners for nearly 100 years. Many family members have returned to St. Joseph's to pray and marvel at its beauty.





Over the years, the statue fell into disrepair. Kevin (great grandson) and Denise Thimmesch of Waverly, KS traveled to Hays in July, 2020 to transport the statue and obtain an assessment for total restoration. Work was completed by Freund Custom Furnishings and on Saturday of Holy Week in 2021, the statue was returned to St. Joseph church for Easter services. All funding was provided by descendants of John and Anna Seitz from across Kansas and out of state. This project was coordinated with support of Fr. Brian Lager.

The Seitz-Sack Genealogy book entitled "From the Steppes of Russia to the Plains of Kansas", compiled by Lucille Richstatter Barrett in May 1999, provides the following account in John's own words...

"I, John Seitz was born on the third day of July, 1861 at Marienthal Government, Aamure Shout, Russia. My father's name was Johannes Seitz and mother's name was Barbara Schoenberger. Both were born in Marienthal, Russia. My wife, Anna Sack was born March 5, 1861 at Siminofka Government, Saruntof, Russia and her father's name was Kaspar Sack and her mother's name was Anna Marie Kuehn. Both were born in Siminofka, Russia. We were always German...never Russians. We never gave up our German citizenship. We always remained German".



The obituary of John Seitz states that he came to the United States at the age of 16 with his parents, and settled in St. Marys, KS. He and Anna were united in marriage on November 18, 1884. John and Anna resided in St. Marys, KS until the Spring of 1895 when the family moved to Cook County, Texas. After a year in Texas, they returned to St. Marys and in 1898 moved to Hays, KS and settled on a farm nine miles southwest of town. Hays is where other Volga-Germans had settled and where some of Anna's family was already living. The family was also in search of a drier climate for Anna's health. To this union, thirteen children were born. Their names were \: Anna (1885), Ignatius (1886 died in childhood), Catherine (1887 died in childhood), Mary Ann (1888\*, Margaret (1890), Aloysius (1891), Catherine (1893), Agnes (1894), Barbara (1895), John (1897 died in xhildhood), Elizabeth (1899), John (1903), Theresa (1905 died in childhood)

After twenty-five years of farming, and in the Fall of 1923 John retired and he and Anna made their home in town at 217 W. 14th street, a block behind St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Hays.





John and Anna Seitz family, with children, spouses and grandchildren at their home in Hays, circa 1924.

John Seitz was instrumental in getting the church financed and built. He hauled in the huge limestone rock up front of the main entrance to the Girls Catholic High School across the street, slung under a wagon carriage and hauled by team of horses several miles from the quarry. John's obituary states that "all his life he was a faithful member of the Catholic Church and died after a lingering illness, having received all the sacraments of the church."

John and Anna are buried in the St. Joseph Church cemetery in Hays.
