

# **PASTOR'S NOTES**

Sacrosanctum,

The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, Vatican II, Series, Part 3

3. Wherefore the sacred Council judges that the following principles concerning the promotion and reform of the liturgy should be called to mind, and that practical norms should be established.


Among these principles and norms there are some which can and should be applied both to the Roman rite and also to all the other rites. The practical norms which follow, however, should be taken as applying only to the Roman rite, except for those which, in the very nature of things, affect other rites as well.

4. Lastly, in faithful obedience to tradition, the sacred Council declares that holy Mother Church holds all lawfully acknowledged rites to be of equal right and dignity; that she wishes to preserve them in the future and to foster them in every way. The Council also desires that, where necessary, the rites be revised carefully in the light of sound tradition, and that they be given new vigor to meet the circumstances and needs of modern times. Some of you that grew up on a farm remember the old milk stool. It would often have three legs supporting the seat upon which the person would sit in order to milk the cows. If one of those legs was missing it would become unbalanced and the person sitting upon it would topple over, (or if an ornery sibling would kick it out from under them). The Church has 3 legs upon which she sits in order to prevent Her from toppling over. Sacred Scripture, Sacred Tradition, and the Magisterium (the teaching authority) are the legs upon which the Church is held up. The word tradition comes from the Latin tradere which means to hand down or to hand over. Tradition is handed down to us not to be manipulated how we want to perceive it, but to be safeguarded so that the truths of our faith may continue to be handed down to the next generation and the teachings of Jesus may be properly passed on and understood as well.

When it comes to the traditions in the Liturgy it is important to hand them down so that Jesus may be handed on as He has been handed on to us. In the Liturgy we come to know the living Jesus in which we participate in the new covenant that He has given us. The liturgy is passed on in the different cultures throughout the world and thus different liturgical rites came about to show the people they were evangelizing Jesus Himself.

The Catechism lists seven rites. These rites so listed: Latin, Byzantine, Alexandrian, Syriac, Armenian, Maronite, and Chaldean, are actually families of liturgical expression. These rites are the descendants of the liturgical practices that originated in centers of Rome, Antioch, and Alexandria.

We are members of the Latin Rite because our ancestors were evangelized by members of the Latin Rite. Sometimes we refer to the Latin Rite as the Roman Rite. As descendants of this liturgical tradition the liturgy has been handed down to us in a specific way and this document desired to reform the liturgy within this tradition to give it a "new vigor" as it states. In the following articles we will continue to see what those changes would be. You will be surprised by what it does say, and what it doesn't say.


